41	Montgomery introduced Bennington Police Department (BPD) Chief Gauthier and Officer		
42	Tatro and asked the Board to consider the proposal for increased security. Montgomery		
43	explained that currently CDC lacks a presence of uniformed law enforcement officer on		
44	campus. This situation arose this past July. Montgomery has met with the staff, faculty and		
45 46	administration to define the their wants and needs. He also met with BPD for their input.		
47	The proposal is to have BPD presence daily for a couple of hours here and there. The cost would be \$6,000 for the year. Montgomery also noted that BPD has articulation

Chief Gauthier spoke briefly of the benefits of having an officer on campus and noted that he was here tonight to answer questions, not to tell the Board what to do.

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Discussion followed with the following topics being addressed:

- → There have been 15-20 arrests over the past several years.
- → CDC had different security needs than MAU because of the Open-Door Policy.
- → What the current security provides versus what an officer can provide and historically what security has been in place on campus. Johnson expressed that if there is a security issue, it should be fixed.
- → The need for and benefits of having a part-time uniformed officer's presence.
- → This change occurred without Montgomery being contacted nor consulted.
- → CDC's assessment with MAU is 12%, which translates to 50 minutes per day.
- → Cost and how the proposal would be paid for including the COPS Grant that may allow for an SRO to be reestablished.
- → If MAU should be paid for the contracted services they are not providing.

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Montgomery summarized that the plan would cover about 100 hours between now and the end of the semester at \$25 - \$27/ hr and be reevaluated in January. There would be no "set" schedule; rather the hours would be varied and therefore not predictable by students. The plan would supplement what is in place now.

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Harrington moved and Corcoran seconded a motion to hire the Bennington Police Department for 100 hours to start. All were in favor except Johnson who voted nay.

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Corcoran moved and Letourneau seconded a motion to pay for the officer out of the savings from the Administrator line. All were in favor except Johnson who voted nay.

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Additional discussion regarding Montgomery not being informed or involved in MAU's decision to change security followed.

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Goodhue moved and Corcoran seconded a motion that we meet with MAU and the powers that be to discuss this issue, our Director's issues and other issues discussed at Finance. All were in favor.

Harrington moved and Alexander seconded a motion to accept the Consent Agenda. All were in favor.

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Business Office Action Item – Credit Card Limit Increase

Lewis presented the need for an increase. The card is used primarily for airline tickets and it is unreasonable to ask teachers to put the charges on their accounts and then receive reimbursement.

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Harrington moved and Johnson seconded a motion to raise the credit card limit from \$7.500 to \$10,000. All were in favor except Johnson who voted nay.

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Committee Reports

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Policy

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Johnson reported that the committee would be meeting Monday at 4:00 PM

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Outreach

Corcoran reported that the committee met October 7. Jessica is working on creating "Viewbooks" that will be placed at the sending schools. In essence, these books are binders that present a more in-depth view of CDC than the program of Studies. Corcoran also reported that the Open House went well, Jessica is working with WEQX regarding ads, there is an easier to change the ad on the Banner's website and a second set of commercials for Comcast is being worked on. The committee is also looking at a subtitle for CDC to enhance recognition.

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Alexander moved and Corcoran seconded a motion that the Board send a Letter of Thanks to the faculty for their working with Jessica Hill to increase the number of students. All were in favor.

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Finance

Lamb turned to Lewis to present the Unifund Proposal. Lewis went through the proposal and answered questions regarding why the switch was needed, cost and where the money would come from. The program will be fully implemented by July 1, 2009 (next fiscal year).

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Alexander moved and Letourneau seconded a motion for CDC to purchase and implement the Unifund software. All were in favor except Johnson who voted nay.

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Harrington moved and Corcoran seconded for a future report as to whether the system is working better in house (or not). All were in favor.

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Director Search

Goodhue reported that of the 25 applicants, the committee has narrowed the field to 10. Their next meeting will be held next Tuesday. The applicant's people and leadership skills will be important in the final selection.

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Superintendent's Report George Carpenter was not in attendance.

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Director's Report

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Montgomery noted that:

- → Building Trades and Forestry were collaborating on a project with MAU to install a wind tower on the Middle School Campus. Central Vermont Solar & Wind and Jim Marsden are also involved. The tower will be assembled on site tomorrow. There is grant opportunity for a larger turbine in the future.
- → The Medical Professions, Human Services and Cosmetology Programs all have students participating in coop work experience.
- 9 → Law Enforcement is very grateful for the cruiser. They have participated in night traffic
 10 stops and spike strip training.
 - → BCIC's Peter Odierna and Dan Maneely from Vt. Composites visited with Montgomery and Lamb at the CDC to discuss local industries' need for employees. They are basically seeking to provide a bigger pool of qualified workers. From this discussion arose talk of CDC possibly providing technical diplomas. Odierna and Maneely would be willing to come before the full Board in November.
 - → The Burr & Burton visit was very positive. They are in the process of working on their scheduling, which is now rotating blocks. The future looks good for Burr & Burton and CDC to work together in cooperating for the benefit of their students.

Chairman's Report

Lamb thanked Sandy Redding for her suggestion that Board members go out and visit other district School Board meetings. The idea is to go to them rather than making them come to us. Montgomery and Lamb will begin implementing Redding's idea at the upcoming Readsboro School Board meeting in November. Any other Board members who would like to attend are welcome to do so.

At 8:04PM Corcoran moved and Goodhue seconded a motion to adjourn. All were in favor.
